LEATHER PROTECTION CREAM

Leather Protection Cream is a water based protector for all Leather types except Nubuck. This is truly an incredible product because it provides excellent protection against oil-water-alcohol based stains as well as help to resist the effects of daily soiling. The Leather Protection Cream places an invisible, breathable barrier between you and your Leather. Our system is for you to protect your Leather first, then follow a routine of cleaning and re-protection.

This way you are not actually cleaning the Leather's original surface, but cleaning from the surface of the protection. Since some Leathers are very porous, the Leather Protection Cream prevents stains from absorbing deeply into the Leather and becoming nearly impossible to remove easily.

Usually, Protected Leathers that have cracked or peeled is not from use, but from body oils and perspiration that have settled down into the grain of the Leather and started to dissolve the finish over time. The Leather Protection Cream will assist in preventing the cracking & peeling when proper cleaning is also done.

Simply apply the Leather Protection Cream to a soft cloth and wipe it on evenly, paying particular attention to high use areas like seats, arms, front railings, and backs. For Aniline Leathers, it is best to apply the Leather Protection Cream twice to all the high use areas.

We recommend fully cleaning and reprotecting your furniture 2-4 times per year. When Leathers are placed in high use rooms (TV area), it may be required to clean and reprotect more often. Pieces like recliners are subject to very heavy use. With Leather, it is much easier to practice prevention than it is to try to resolve major challenges after the fact.

Leather Protection Cream will also work to remove small surface scratches on Aniline Leathers. In general, the Leather Protection Cream is used as a final step in combination with most of the Leather Master repair or touch-up products.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Shake the bottle well before using!
2. Pour the Leather Protection Cream into a soft, lint free cloth and wipe evenly on the surface of the Leather, paying particular attention to high use areas like seats, arms, front railings and backs.
3. Allow to dry 1/2 hour.
4. For sensitive Leathers like Aniline, apply a second layer to insure protection.

Leather Protection Cream Glossy: This product has all the benefits of the Protection Cream, but dries to a gloss sheen. This is recommended for high gloss and Buffalo Leathers.

LEATHER SOFT CLEANER

Leather Soft Cleaner is a waterbased cleaner that can be used on all Leather types. This is a mild cleaner that will not affect the Leather's original properties or finish. Leather Soft Cleaner will clean most soiling as well as waterbased stains. Most cleaners contain solvents like alcohol or mineral spirits. These types of cleaners will definitely clean, but also will attack either the finish or dry the Leather out. Leather Soft Cleaner is solvent free and works without removing finish or harming the Leather. The only time that Leather Soft Cleaner could remove color or change the Leather is under the following circumstances:

1. If the Leather is not colorfast to any type of liquid. You can test this by wetting a soft, white cloth with distilled or purified water and wiping the Leather. If color comes off on the cloth from only purified water, the Leather Soft Cleaner or anything else will also remove color.
2. If the Leather Soft Cleaner appears to have darkened the Leather, it is extremely absorbent. The Leather has shrunk. The Leather has not gotten darker, but each dot of color has gotten closer together, thus giving the appearance of becoming dark. All you need to do is to stretch the Leather by pulling it in all directions. You will see the color lighten.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Shake the bottle well before using!
2. Pour some Leather Soft Cleaner into a sponge and squeeze to produce a white foam. The foam aerates the cleaner to prevent overwetting the Leather, and it produces a lifting effect.
3. Work the foam into the Leather with the sponge into areas where the soiling is heavier. You can rub the Leather with the sponge for it puts a cushion between you and the Leather, stopping you from rubbing too hard. The sponge also has a drawing effect to pull the stain out.
4. Wipe the excess foam and the soiling away with a soft, white, cotton cloth. If you need to clean large areas, rinse the sponge in clear water when it starts to appear dirty.
5. For Aniline Leathers, it works best to dry the area that you have cleaned with a hair dryer.
6. For heavy soiling or dye transfer like blue jean, you will need to use a stronger product like Strong Cleaner or Super Remover/Cleaner.
7. After you are satisfied with the results of the cleaning, use the Leather Protection Cream as a final step to renew the protective effect on the Leather.

Leather Soft Cleaner is great to use in combination with weekly dusting. To use: lightly wet a soft cotton cloth (diapers work great) with the Leather Soft Cleaner and wipe down the Leather. This will remove light soiling and the accumulation of dust. Leather is a perfect material for dust sensitive persons because you can fully remove the dust from the surface of Leather. Fabric allows the dust to penetrate between the fibers and into the foam or filling, making it nearly impossible to remove.
